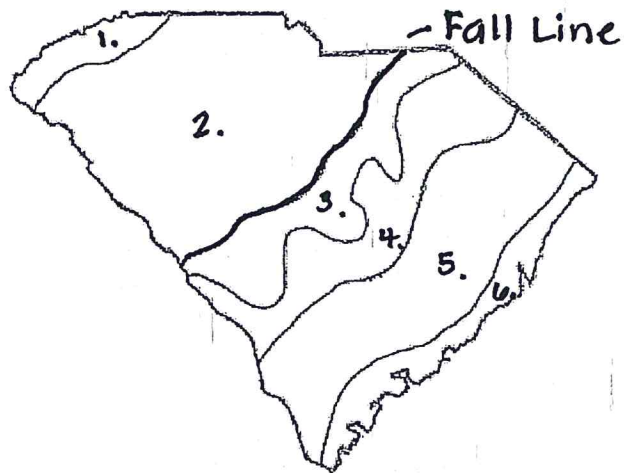


Students need to be able locate the six land regions, along with the Fall Line.

Students need to know important facts about each region.

### Blue Ridge

- Blue Ridge Mountains
- Has highest point in the state - Sassafras Mountain
- Table Rock / *Caesar's Head*
- Lake Jocassee and dam - provide electricity for nearby residents
- Many waterfalls; whitewater rafting popular
- Smallest region

### Piedmont

- Foot of the Mountain; also known as "foothills"
- Rolling hills and valleys
- Monadnock - King's Mountain
- Christmas trees, apple and peach orchards, and textile mills
- Gaffney Water Tower - The Peachoid

### Sand Hills

- Sandy soil because coast of SC was here millions of years ago
- State capital - Columbia
- Peachtree Rock near Lexington
- Sesquicentennial State Park
- Hog and turkey farms
- Loblolly pine trees

## Fall Line

- Located between Piedmont and Sand Hills Regions
- Piedmont drops to the lower land of the Sand Hills
- Large rocks and small waterfalls are seen in water of rivers and streams
- Years ago, riverboats could not go any farther than the Fall Line

## Inner Coastal Plain

- Best soil in the state
- Flat with some hills
- Lake Marion, Francis Marion University, Darlington Racetrack
- Tobacco, wheat, strawberry, and cotton farms

## Outer Coastal Plain

- Land is very flat with many swamps
- Santee Cooper dam - provides hydroelectric power
- Cypress Gardens and Francis Beidler Forest

## Coastal Zone

- Next to Atlantic Ocean
- Many barrier islands and beaches
- Charleston
- Many people visit historic homes, buildings, and golf courses
- Morris Island Lighthouse

## Vocabulary Words

**delta**: a triangular-shaped piece of land where a river meets the ocean

**erosion**: the wearing away of land by wind and water

**fall line**: the line of waterfalls and rapids where the rivers come down from the hills

**natural resource**: something found in nature that people can use

**plain**: an area of low, flat land

**plateau**: a high, mostly flat area of land

**port**: a town or city with a harbor where ships load and unload; a harbor

**region**: an area made up of places that share things in common; a land division based on common features
